The golden head of the statue represents the kingdom of Babylon and King Nebuchadnezzar II (c. 605-562 BC).

The silver chest and arms of the statue represent the kingdom of Media-Persia and King Darius I (c. 522-486 BC).

The iron legs of the statue represent the kingdom of Rome and King Augustus (c. 63 BC - AD 14).

(Jesus Christ)

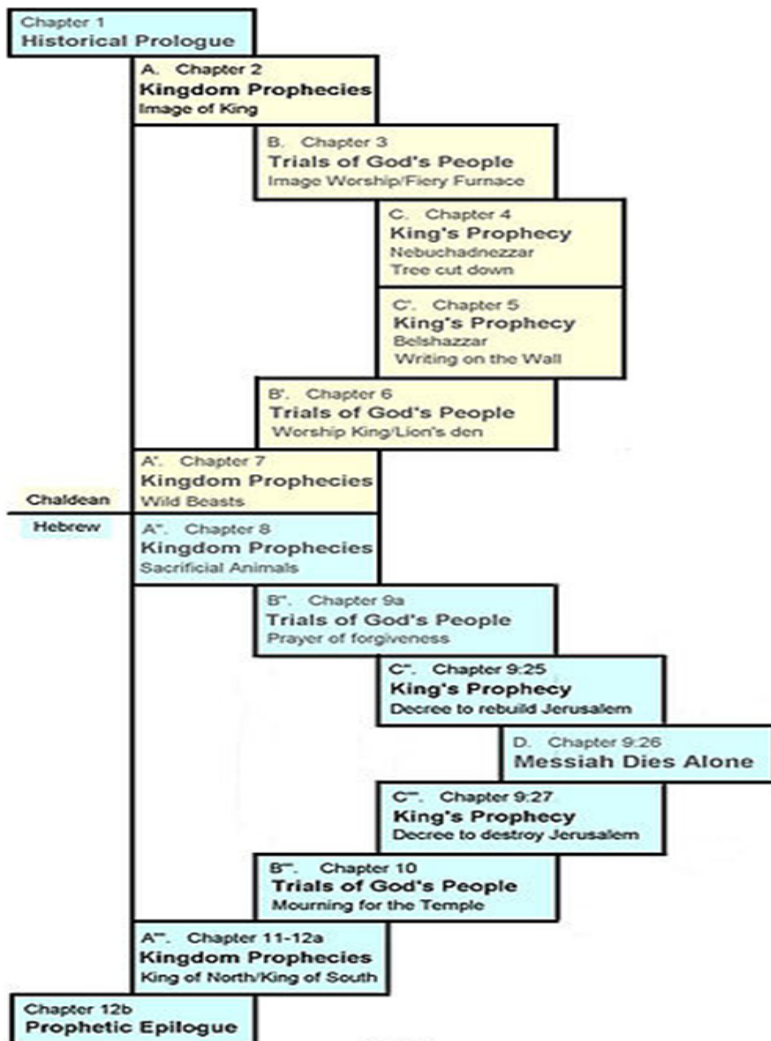
The stone represents the kingdom of God and Jesus Christ (c. AD 30).
